Scope of PM- USHA: 1) Focus Districts and 2) Challenge method selection of institutions

1) Focus Districts:

Maximum 50% District of the State will be considered as focus District

- Lack of access to government colleges
- Low GER,
- Population proportion for females, transgender, SC, ST,OBCs
- Aspirational /Boarder Area, left wing extremism prone area
- Gender parity

2) Challenge method selection of institutions:

Institutions will be short listed by the state by giving priority to the focus areas. On the basis of pre defined criteria weightages will be given to different institutions for proposal submission The proposal bill be submitted and it will be evaluated by MoE and approval will be done by PAB at central level
