

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Chapter - 1

Introduction

1.1. Background of RUSA

The 12th five year plan proposed a comprehensive plan for the development of state higher education system for ensuring access, equity and quality. The Planning Commission recommended strategic utilization of central funds to ensure comprehensive and optimum planning at the state level. This led to the formulation of the ambitious Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) namely Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA).

1.2. An overview of RUSA 1.0

RUSA, launched in 2013 provides strategic funding to eligible state higher educational institutions. The central funding which is in the ratio of 60:40 for general category states and 90:10 for special category states and 100% for union territories is based on norms and is outcome dependent. From the Central Ministry funds flow through the state governments/union territories to the State Higher Education Councils before reaching the identified institutions.

In order to produce employable and competitive graduates, post-graduates and PhDs, RUSA emphasis on the improvement of the quality of teaching-learning processes. RUSA aims to create new universities through up gradation of existing autonomous colleges and by conversion of colleges to a cluster. It also aims to create new model degree colleges, new professional colleges and provide infrastructural support to universities and colleges. Faculty recruitment support, faculty improvement programmes and leadership development of educational administrators are important aspects of the scheme. To enhance skill development the existing central scheme of Polytechnics has been absorbed within RUSA. Besides, in the participating states RUSA supports reforming, restructuring and building capacity of the institutions.

The primary components of RUSA are

- Up gradation of Existing Autonomous Colleges to Universities
- Conversion of Colleges to Cluster Universities
- Infrastructure Grants to Universities
- New Model Colleges (General)
- Up gradation of Existing Degree Colleges to Model Colleges
- New Colleges (Professional)
- Infrastructure Grants to colleges
- Research, Innovation and Quality Improvement
- Equity Initiatives
- Faculty Recruitment Support
- Faculty Improvements
- Vocationalization of Higher Education

- Leadership Development of Educational Administrators
- Institutional Restructuring &Reforms
- Capacity Building &Preparation, Data Collection &Planning

RUSA was contrived in the state of Assam under the strong initiative of the Government of Assam to achieve access, equity and for fostering excellence in higher education in the state as per the objectives of the 11th and 12th plan of India. Since then RUSA has been facilitating all essential and necessary assistance within the scope of its objectives to improve the overall education scenario of the state.

The positive impact of RUSA assistance in higher education can be understood from the valid NAAC accreditation status of the colleges, the ratings of which surged after receiving RUSA grants. This is a noteworthy achievement because accreditation plays a critical role in the institution's overall improvement, enhancing its societal image and status. It helps the institution to know its strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, challenges and identifies internal areas of planning and resource allocation. Minimum B Grade in NAAC's accreditation is required for the institutions to be eligible for any RUSA fund.

RUSA is a scheme operated in Mission mode. It aims to improve the overall quality of existing State Higher Educational Institutions by ensuring their conformity to prescribed norms and adoption of accreditation as a mandatory quality.

1.3. Eligibility Criteria

All State public universities and colleges with both 12B and 2(f) are eligible for RUSA 1.0 fund. For the component, Infrastructure Grants to Universities, priority has been given to the universities which were identified by UGC to give catch-up grants. Again, priority has also been accorded on the basis of valid NAAC accreditation. For the other components like Infrastructure Grants to Colleges, Upgradation of Existing Degree Colleges to Model Degree Colleges valid NAAC accreditation with minimum B grade is a must. For Upgradation of Existing Degree colleges to Model Degree Colleges all the selected districts should be non-educationally backward districts. For Model Degree Colleges selected district should be an educationally backward district. For the component Equity Initiatives which aims to create a situation whereby everyone gets an equal opportunity, the state as a whole is considered as a unit. Priorities, in terms of funding, are given to institutions that have plans to create equal opportunity cells, language laboratories, impart remedial classes, provide financial aid and scholarships for socially and economically backward students, initiate equity and gender sensitization campaigns, take up innovative schemes to ensure greater inclusion and strive to maximize the participation rate of SC/ST/OBCs.

1.5. Objectives of the Study

The Outcome Study Report attempts to analyze the impact of RUSA 1.0 on the beneficiary institutions.

Objectives of this report are:

- To study the utilization of RUSA1.0 funds, received under various sanctioned projects, by the beneficiary institutions
- To analyze the achievements of the beneficiary institutions in terms of successful completion of the projects sanctioned by RUSA 1.0.
- To understand the benefits accruing to the students because of the successful implementation of said projects.
- To assist the institutions in their overall understanding of the quality improvements that can accrue to the institutions upon successful implementation of projects funded under RUSA 1.0.

1.6. Methodology

In the preparation of the Outcome Study Report the census method or the complete enumeration method has been adopted. Here all the beneficiary institutions i.e. the institutions which have received funds under RUSA 1.0 have been selected for data collection. The various components under RUSA 1.0, Assam are:

- Infrastructure Grants to Universities
- Infrastructure Grants to Colleges
- Upgradation of Existing Degree Colleges to Model Degree Colleges
- Equity Initiatives
- New Model Degree Colleges (Erstwhile)
- New Professional Colleges

The quantitative method of data collection has been used where data on the utilization of RUSA funds received by the institutions under infrastructure grants for new construction, renovation/upgradation and purchase of new equipments have been obtained from the various beneficiary institutions. Data thus collected have been tabulated, presented and analyzed. Data have also been obtained from those few institutions which have received funds under the component Equity Initiatives. These data have also been tabulated, presented and analyzed.

While preparing the report conscious efforts have always been made to check whether the information provided by the institutions were complete and authentic.

If any error or mistake was detected then the institutions were immediately contacted to rectify the same.

Barring a few exceptions it was a very pleasant experience to prepare this Outcome Study Report.

1.7. Scope and Limitation

The Outcome Study Report analyses the utilization of the RUSA fund by the beneficiary institutions and their achievements. It also highlights the impact of the use of the RUSA fund on students' benefits.

There are a number of limitations in the preparation of this report related to data and use of statistical techniques.

The scope of this Outcome Study Report is restricted to the state of Assam. Data used in this report have been collected from the beneficiary institution of RUSA 1.0 in the state of Assam. Therefore the result of this Outcome Report may not be applicable to the whole of India. It is likely that in some context specific information may have been omitted which may have affected the accuracy of impact estimation.

1.8 Sources of data and its authentication

Data have been collected from various institutions like universities and colleges. From RUSA office the concerned officer had sent to all the beneficiary institutions a letter with a specific format requesting all to provide the required information in the format and send back to

RUSA office within a stipulated time. After receiving the responses from the different institutions data thus provided have been tabulated, presented and analyzed.

1.9 Organization of the Report

Chapter - 2

Financial Analysis

2.1 Introduction

Finance Audit and Accounts Branch of RUSA Assam deals with Government fund released by the Central Government as well as State Government. Mission Director is the DDO as well as sanctioning authority in respect of fund. The workflow starts from the accountant, however, from March 2020 Accounts Assistant, whose post has been created recently is the bottom level officer of the branch. Accountant is the key person of the branch who is solely responsible for all kinds of data/fund management. Any bill received from the vendor is initially registered in the Bill Register Management System. Afterwards, if approved by Mission Director it is to be released to the vendor subject to issue of a sanctioning order. Accountant is the key person for issue of the sanctioning order. Since September, 2019 all kinds of bills other than the Preparatory Grant, if the amount is more than 5 lakhs, is endorsed to Government for approval.

The Financial Records which are maintained by this branch are as follows:

- A) Central Cash Book
- B) Ledger Account
- C) Bill Register
- D) Cheque Book Register
- E) PHMS Management System

During RUSA 1.0, funds have been transferred to State/UTs only after the approval of the respective state plan by the PAB, the project Directorate MHRD carry out sanctions on the PFMS portal of the Controller General of Accounts (CAG).

The State contributes their share alongwith Central Share to the dedicated RUSA account of the SHEC.

SHEC than transfers the funds to the dedicated RUSA account of the Institutions upon the receipt of the combined pool of funds from the state Government. The funds are released to the Beneficiary Institutions in the ratio 35:35:30 i.e. Construction: Renovation: New Equipment. The colleges are asked to carry the expenditures only on the basis of the approved ratio.

The transfer of fund takes place through the Public Financial Management System (PFMS) portal so as to ensure the following:

- Track the flow of funds.
- Online information of bank balance.
- Track the utilization of money.
- Ultimate e-payment to the Beneficiary.
- Dissemination of relevant information to the end users.
- Decision support system for all levels of program heads.
- Enhance transparency and accountability in public expenditure.

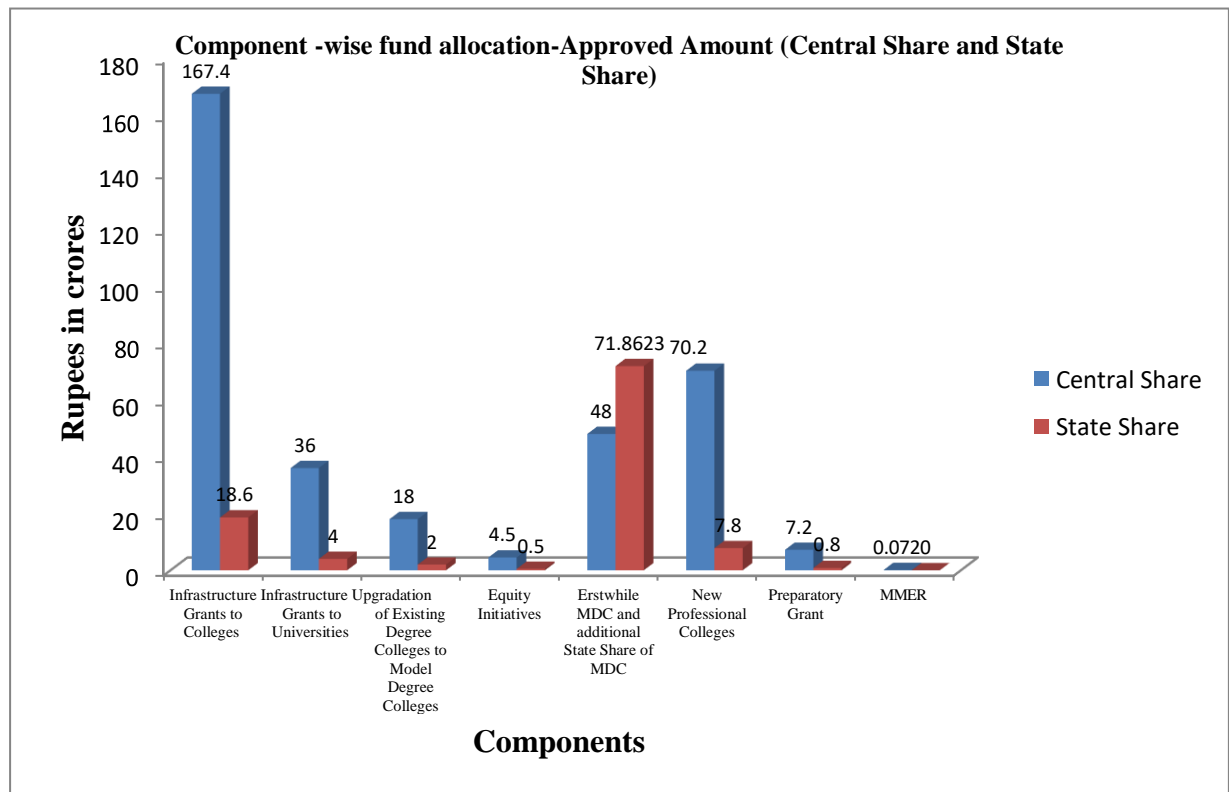

2.4 An analysis of Fund Allocation

The total approved fund under RUSA 1.0 is Rs. 456.93 crores out of which Rs. 351.37 crores is Central Share and Rs. 105.56 crores is State Share. The amount released by MHRD to State is Rs.299.022 crores out of which only Rs. 295.9 crores has been deposited in RUSA account alongwith the matching State Share of Rs.88.26 crores.

MHRD, Government of India has approved funds to RUSA (Assam) through the Government of Assam under RUSA 1.0 against 8 (Eight) components. The components and component wise fund details are as follows:

1. Total approved fund for 93 Beneficiary Institutions under the component Infrastructure Grant to Colleges is Rs. 186.00 crores out of which Rs. 167.4 crores is for Central Share and Rs. 18.6 crores is for State Share. As of today MHRD has released Rs.160.65 crores Central Share and matching State Share of Rs. 17.60 crores has also been released.

RUSA, Assam has released an amount of Rs. 171.00 crores to the respective Beneficiary Institutions. Whereas, Rs. 3.60 crores (C.S) and Rs. 0.50 (S.S) crores deposited on 31st March, 2020 will be released in a short period. Moreover, Utilization Certificates for Rs 144.91 crores has been furnished to MHRD.

2. Total approved fund for 2 universities under the component Infrastructure Grants to Universities is 40 crores out of which 36 crores is for Central Share and Rs. 4 crores is for State Share. As of today MHRD has released all of its Central Share and matching State Share of Rs. 4 crores has also been released. RUSA, Assam has already released the entire amount to the respective Universities. Moreover, Utilization Certificates for the whole amount has also been furnished to MHRD.
3. Total approved fund for 5 Beneficiary Institutions under the component Upgradation of Existing Degree Colleges into MDC is Rs. 20.00 crores out of which Rs. 18.00 crores is for Central Share and Rs. 2.00 crores is for State Share. As of today MHRD has released Rs.18.00 crores Central Share and matching State Share of Rs. 2.00 crores has also been released. RUSA, Assam has released the entire amount to the respective Beneficiary Institutions. Moreover, Utilization Certificates for Rs 14.79 crores has been furnished to MHRD.
4. Total approved fund for 29 Beneficiary Institutions under the component Equity Initiatives is Rs. 5.00 crores out of which Rs. 4.50 crore is for Central Share and Rs. 0.50 crores is for State Share. As of today MHRD has released Rs. 4.50 crores as Central Share and matching State Share of Rs. 0.50 crores has also been released. RUSA, Assam has released the entire amount to the respective Beneficiary Institutions. Moreover, Utilization Certificates for Rs 3.565 crores has been furnished to MHRD.
5. Total approved fund for 12 Model Degree Colleges under the component New Model Degree Colleges is Rs. 108.00 crores out of which Rs. 48.00 crores is for Central Share and Rs. 60.00 crores is for State Share. As of today MHRD has released Rs. 37.5 crores as Central Share and matching State Share of Rs. 47.10 crores has also been released. Moreover, an additional amount of Rs. 11.8623 crores as additional State Share for procurement of furniture, lab equipments etc. for the 5 numbers of functional MDCs has also been deposited in RUSA account. An amount of Rs. 65.710 crores is expended till date for construction of 9 numbers of Model Degree Colleges. Moreover, Utilization Certificates for Rs 50.91 crores has been furnished to MHRD.
6. Total approved fund for 3 Professional Colleges under the component New Professional College is Rs. 78.00 crores out of which Rs. 70.20 crores is for Central Share and Rs. 7.8 crores is for State Share. As of today MHRD has released Rs. 35.10 crores as Central Share and matching State Share of Rs. 3.9 crores has also been released. An amount of Rs. 0.0214 crores is expended till date and Utilization Certificates sent to MHRD is nil.

7. An amount of Rs. 8.00 crores has been approved under the head Preparatory Grant, out of which Rs. 7.2 crores is Central Share and Rs. 0.80 crores is State Share. As of today MHRD has released the entire amount alongwith the matching State Share. An amount of Rs. 3.54 crores has been expended till date under this component. Moreover, Utilization Certificates for Rs 2.99 crores has been furnished to MHRD.
8. An amount of Rs. 0.072 crores Central Share has been approved under the head Management Monitoring Evaluation Research (MMER). As of today MHRD has released the entire amount and the whole amount has already been expended by RUSA, Assam. Moreover, Utilization Certificates for the whole amount has already been furnished to MHRD.

Audit Report

RUSA Assam has conducted audit of 101 nos of RUSA Beneficiary Institutions for the period 2014-2019. The audit was conducted by following all administrative and financial procedures as per State Government, such as forming a committee for selection of CA firms, selection of Audit firm through inviting EOI from registered CA firms, issuing work order etc. In this process 6 numbers of CA firms were selected whose major findings are given below:

Financial lapse

Some of the Beneficiary Institutions have failed to maintain books of accounts such as stock register, asset register etc and also have failed to maintain proper voucher number in cash book.

Some of the colleges have transferred RUSA fund to college fund with a clarification that when the RUSA fund was not deposited in their account they performed some of the RUSA related works by taking a loan from their College General fund and hence it was reimbursed. Further, some of the colleges have expended the interest amount earned from RUSA fund.

Administrative Lapse

Some of the Beneficiary Institutions have failed to maintain the ratio of Renovation, Equipment and New Construction and some of the institutions have failed timely completion of projects.

Measures adopted for correction by RUSA, Assam

Based on the CA firms audit report necessary corrective measures need to be undertaken in the right spirit. If any of the Beneficiary Institutions fail to adhere to any financial or administrative rules as per the MHRD guideline or as per the written Release Letter given by the office of the Mission Director RUSA to the institutions, then a notice prepared by Accounts Branch with the approval of Mission Director is sent to the Beneficiary Institution asking clarification for such lapse. Thereafter, upon receiving the reply necessary action is taken with the approval of Mission Director RUSA Assam.

Chapter - 3

University Fund Allocation

3.1. Introduction

Under RUSA 1.0, State Universities were given a grant of Rs. 20 crore each during the 12th plan period for covering up critical infrastructural needs for immediate improvement of quality like upgrading of libraries, laboratories, equipments, hostels, toilets etc.

Priorities for funding were on the basis of the following criteria:

- Prime priority has been given to the universities which were identified by UGC to give catch-up grants and Universities were prioritized for purpose of funding according to the following norms:
 - a. Universities which have not been included under section 12B. Further these Universities have been prioritized on the basis of the year of establishment.
 - b. Universities included under section 12B but have not received funding.
- Within the above mentioned categories (a) and (b), those universities which have either already implemented or given the commitment to the earliest implementation of various reforms such as institutional governance, examination, academic and vocationalization of higher education have been given priority over other universities which have not implemented/given commitment to implement reforms.
- NAAC accreditation, which have a direct impact on teaching learning process of a University. If the University has not been accredited, its status while applying for accreditation has been considered.
- Universities which have special attributes, character and antiquity.
- Universities having student-centric facilities.

Commitments:

- Institution shall agree to obey a Disclosure Management Framework.
- Institution should obey the principle of mid-course assessment and evaluation.

Under the component Infrastructure grants to Universities, Assam had received Rs. 20 crore each against 2 universities namely Gauhati University and Dibrugarh University. The two Universities have been provided funds for New Construction, purchase of New Equipments and Renovation/Upgradation. However, Dibrugarh University also received funds under

Equity Initiatives under 3 sub-components viz. Disabled Friendly Facilities, Training to Trainers of Finishing School and Finishing School.

3.2 Infrastructural Development: New Construction

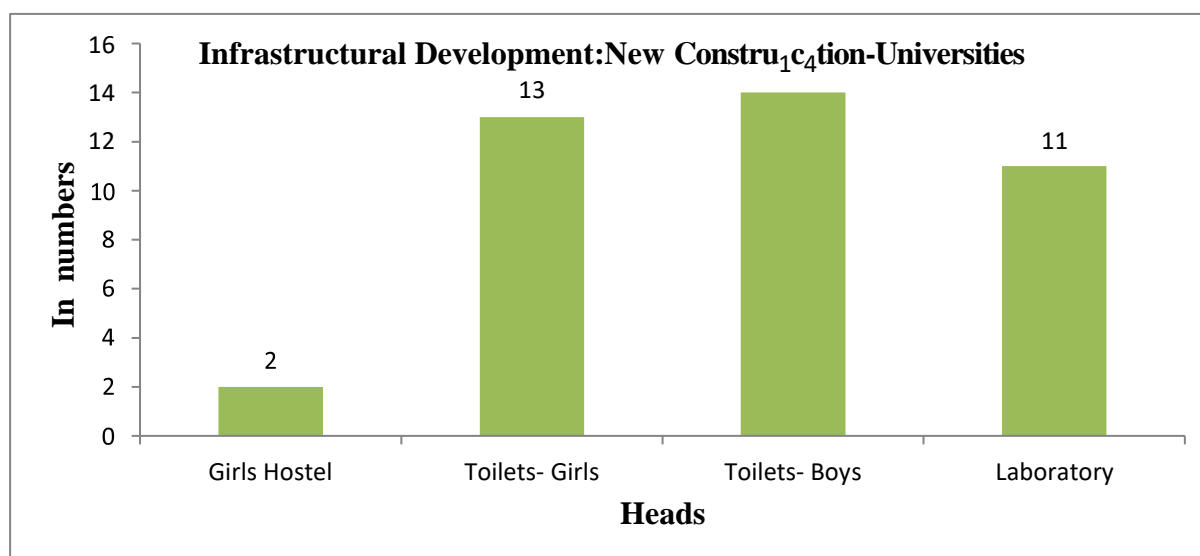
Under the component Infrastructure Grants to Universities: New Construction, two girls hostel, 13 toilets for girls, 14 toilets for boys and 11 laboratories have been constructed by the two Universities with a total area of 5100 sq mt. and a cost of Rs. 1405.72 lakhs . Table 3.1 presents in details the New Construction of the two universities.

The two universities have renovated their Academic Block, Administrative Block, Campus, Hostels, Toilets, Libraries, Smart Classrooms, Auditoriums, Canteens/Cafeterias, Laboratories, Computer Centres/E-Campus and playground. The total amount incurred for these renovation work was Rs. 1394.28 lakhs.

3.4 New Equipments

Sports facilities have been enhanced in the universities and they have also purchased computers, laboratory equipments and books/e-journals. Total amount spent on New

Equipments by the two Universities was Rs. 1200 lakhs. Details of New Equipments purchased by the Universities are shown in Table 3.3.

Table 3.4 shows that under Equity Initiatives Dibrugarh University has made provisions for many disabled friendly facilities like Ramp & Railing, Disabled Friendly Toilets, Disable Friendly Equipments, Braille Books, Audio Books, Hearing Aids and Softwares. The university has also trained trainers for finishing school.

Chapter - 4

Infrastructural Development in Colleges

4.1 Introduction

Under the component Infrastructure Grants to Colleges, colleges were given a grant of Rs. 2 crore each during the 12th plan period for meeting critical infrastructural needs especially for creating/ upgrading laboratories, libraries, equipments, hostels, toilets etc.

Priorities for funding were on the basis of the following criteria:

- Priority was given to the Colleges for the purpose of funding according to
 1. Colleges which were not included under section 12B. These colleges were further prioritized on the basis of year of establishment.
 2. Colleges included under section 12B but had not received funding.

Within the categories (1) and (2) colleges were divided into category A, B & C on the basis of the following criteria:

- No of Students
- Year of Establishment
- Percentage of SC/ST/OBC and women students.
- NAAC grade.

If the institution was not accredited, its status while applying for accreditation was considered. Further colleges not covered by UGC grants were preferred.

Under the component Infrastructure Grants to colleges Assam had received Rs. 2 crore each against 87 number of colleges. The colleges have been provided funds for New Construction, purchase of New Equipment and Renovation/Upgradation.

4.2 Classrooms

Of the 87 beneficiary colleges, 69 of them have constructed classrooms. The total number being 266 with a total area of 17127.327 sq. mt. and a total cost of Rs. 3781.33 lakhs. Table 4.1 presents in details new construction of classrooms in the beneficiary colleges.

4.5 Hostels

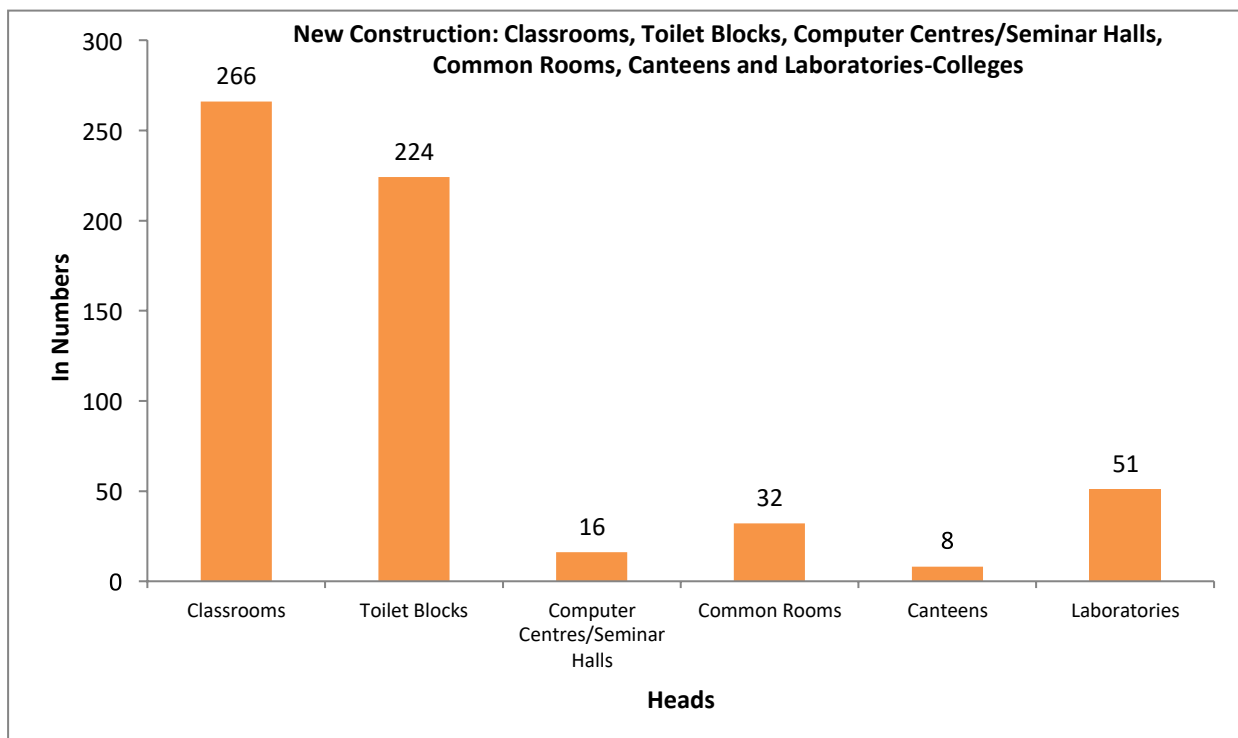

Chapter - 5

Renovation Work in Colleges

The main objective is to improve / upgrade the existing facilities available within the institutions for the benefit of students. The grant covers:

- Upgradation of Academic Blocks
- Upgradation of Administrative Blocks
- Campus Development
- Renovations of Hostels
- Renovation of toilets
- Renovation of Libraries
- Renovation of Classrooms
- Renovation of Auditoriums
- Renovation of Canteens / Cafeterias
- Renovation of Laboratories
- Renovation of Computer Centres / Seminar Halls

Total fund approved under this sub-component for each beneficiary institution is Rs. 70 lakhs.

Chapter - 7

Upgradation of Existing Degree Colleges to Model Degree Colleges

7.1: Introduction

Non-educationally backward districts are selected for this component. Each college receive an amount of Rs. 4.00 crore under this component in 90:10 ratio.

Funding priorities for this scheme are:

- High proportion of socially and economically backward population.
- Low GER for female students.
- Low GER for ST/SC.
- Colleges with large student population.

All the colleges which receive fund under this component have to fulfill the following commitments:

- Hostel and toilets for girls.
- 50% boarding capacity of the hostel would be used for socially and economically weaker sections.
- Ensure a disabled-friendly campus.
- Ensure special facilities/equipments for the disabled.

Amount approved for this component was Rs. 20.00 crore for five number of colleges of Assam in 90:10 ratio.

The colleges selected under this component in Assam are:

- Pub- Kamrup College in Kamrup (Rural) district
- Tangla College in Udalguri district
- Dergaon Kamal Dowerah College in Golaghat district
- Sibsagar Girls' College in Sibsagar district
- Dhemaji College in Dhemaji district

Figure 7.1: New Construction: Laboratories and Computer Centres: Existing Degree Colleges upgraded to MDCs

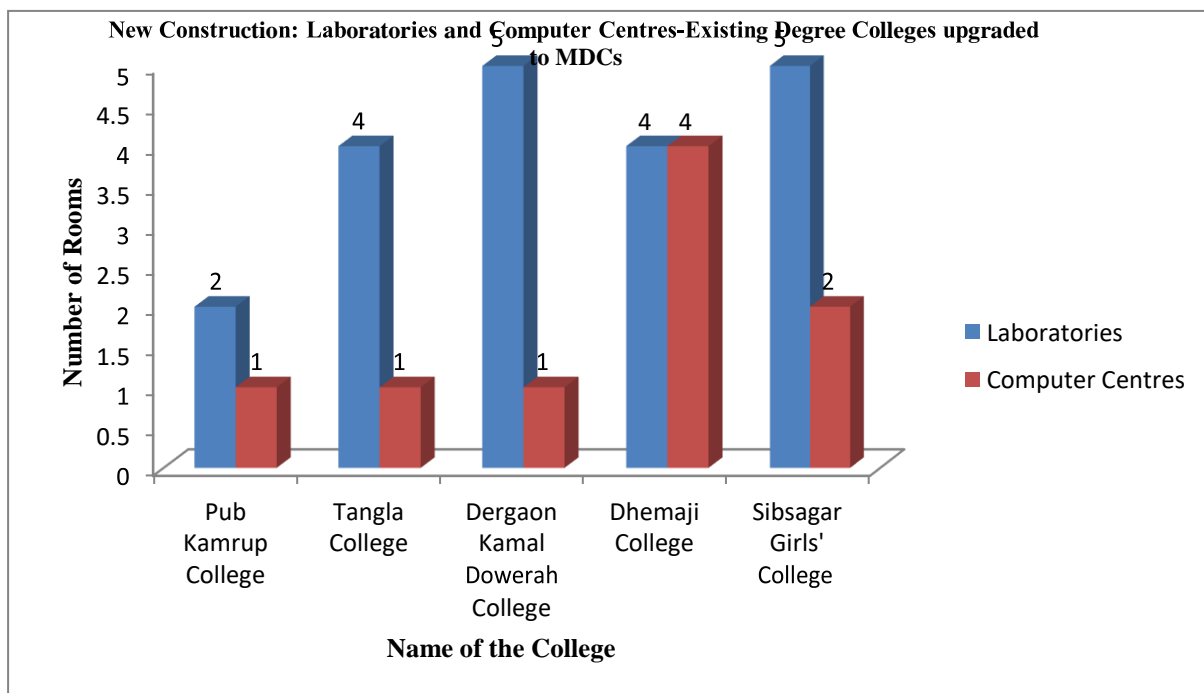


Figure 7.1 depicts the new construction of laboratories and computer centres by the five Existing Degree Colleges which have been upgraded to MDCs.

Chapter - 8

Equity Initiatives

8.1 Introduction

Equity Initiatives is a component under RUSA to ensure greater inclusion of the marginalized sections of the society. The purpose is to create a situation whereby everyone gets an equal opportunity. Under Equity Initiatives, the state as a whole is considered as a unit and it is being carried out in two phases viz. RUSA 1.0 and RUSA 2.0.

Under RUSA 1.0, each state was given an amount of Rs. 5 crore. Priorities in terms of funding were given to institutions that have plans to create equal opportunity cells, remedial classes, language laboratories, financial aid and scholarships for socially and economically backward students, equity and gender sensitization campaigns, innovative schemes to ensure greater inclusion, maximize participation rate of SC/ST/OBCs.

In Assam, under RUSA 1.0 a total of 29 colleges have received funds under various sub-components viz., barrier free facilities for differently abled students, transportation facilities for female and differently abled students, training to the trainers of finishing school, finishing school and language laboratories. The colleges that have received funds under RUSA 1.0 under various sub-components are given below.

8.2 Disabled Friendly Facilities

Funds for this sub-component have been received by Sonapur College, Jorhat Engineering College, Cotton College (now Cotton University) and Debraj Roy College.

The main objective was to create barrier free facilities for differently abled students who enroll in the institutes every year. Such facilities include:

- Hearing Aids
- Braille Books
- Audio Books
- Disabled friendly equipments
- Ramps and Railings

Total approved amount under this sub-component for each beneficiary institution was Rs 20 lakhs. Table 8.1 presents in details the disabled friendly facilities available in the four beneficiary colleges.

Chapter - 9

New Model Degree College (Erstwhile)

9.1 Introduction

New Model Degree Colleges: Central Government identified 374 educationally backward districts where Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) for higher education was less than the National GER (12.4%) in the year 2008-2009.

The Government of Assam decided to set up 12 model degree colleges in all the 12 Educationally Backward Districts (EBDs) as a centrally sponsored scheme with 1:1 fund sharing or in 50:50 ratio. Following are few commitments under this component

- Provisions for Girls' hostel and toilets.
- 50% boarding capacity of the hostel would be used for socially and economically weaker sections.
- Make the campus disabled friendly.

Approved amount for this component was Rs. 108.00 crore (Rs. 48.00 crores from central share + Rs. 48.00 crores from state share and another Rs. 12.00 crores from State Government sponsored fund for construction of Girls' Hostel).

The 12 colleges are as follows

- Government MDC- Dalgaon (Known as PDUAM- Dalgaon) in Darrang district
- Government MDC- Behali (Known as PDUAM- Behali) in Biswanath district
- Government MDC- Amjonga (Known as PDUAM- Amjonga) in Goalpara district
- Government MDC-Tulungia (Known as PDUAM- Tulungia) in Bongaigaon district
- Government MDC- Eraligool (Known as PDUAM- Eraligool) in Karimganj district
- Government MDC- Borkhola in Cachar district
- Government MDC- Deithor in Karbi Anglong district
- Government MDC- Kakopathar in Tinsukia district
- Government MDC- South Salmara in South Salmara district
- Government MDC- Samaguri in Nagaon district
- Government MDC- Lahorighat in Morigaon district
- Government MDC- Katlichera in Hailakandi district

9.2 Government MDC- Dalgaon (Known as PDUAM- Dalgaon): The College is situated in Dalgaon, Darrang District. The college has been functional since 2017. It is a Science college. Total number of students in this college is 500 and total number of faculties is 23.

9.3 Government MDC- Behali (Known as PDUAM- Behali): The College is situated in Biswanath District. It is a science college. College has been functional since 2017. Total number of students in this college is 220 and the college has 17 number of teachers.

9.4 Government MDC- Amjonga (Known as PDUAM- Amjonga): The College is situated in Goalpara District. It is a science college. College has been functional since 2017.

The college has 18 number of teachers and 370 students.

9.5 Government MDC-Tulungia (Known as PDUAM- Tulungia): The College has been functional since 2017. It is situated in Bongaigaon District. It is a commerce college. The college has a total capacity of 400 students and it has 23 number of permanent faculty members.

9.6 Government MDC- Eraligool (Known as PDUAM- Eraligool): The College is in Karimganj District. It is a Science college. The college has been functional since 2017. It has 210 number of students and 30 number of teachers.

9.7 Government MDC- Borkhola: The College is being constructed in Cachar district. The construction of this college is going on. Administrative building has been completed. Physical Progress of this college is 62%. It is hoped that the college will be functional from this academic session i.e. 2020.

9.8 Government MDC- Deithor: The College has been constructed in Karbi Anglong District. Construction of this college is going on. Physical progress of this college is 55%. It is hoped that the college will be functional from this academic session i.e. 2020.

9.9 Government MDC- Kakopathar: It is situated in Tinsukia District. Construction of this college is going on. It is hoped that the college will be functional from this academic session i.e. 2020. Physical progress of this college is 65%.

9.10. Government MDC- South Salmara: It has been constructed at South Salmara District. Construction work has been started. Development of approach road to the site has been taken up by the contractor. Physical progress of the college is 5%.

9.11 Government MDC- Samaguri: The College is in Nagaon District. Physical Progress of this college is 28.5%. Total land required for the project is 30 bighas. However, as of date only 10 bighas are available, which is insufficient for completion of the residential part. Retendering will be done soon.

9.12 Government MDC- Lahorighat: It is in Morigaon District. Construction of the college will be started very soon.

9.13 Government MDC- Katlichera: It is situated at Hailakandi District. Site has been allotted at Boldaboldi. Survey work of the site has been completed. It has been found that huge earth cutting will be required for developing the site. Accordingly an estimate for Rs. 3.00 crore has been submitted to the Government of Assam.

A detailed asset list of the five functional MDCs viz. PDUAM Amjonga, PDUAM Dalgaon, PDUAM Behali, PDUAM Eraligool and PDUAM Tulungia is presented in Table 9.2.

Chapter - 10

New Professional Colleges

10.1 Introduction

New Colleges (Professional) is a component under RUSA 1.0 to create new professional colleges in regions and districts of the country where the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in technical and professional education is below national averages. Under RUSA 1.0, each institution was granted a maximum amount of Rs 26 crore under various heads. However, institutions have the flexibility in terms of selecting the heads on the basis of their needs which is required to be supported by proper documentation. Priorities in terms of funding were given to districts with zero professional college (category A) and districts with one professional college (category B). However, districts in category A were given priority over category B; and within category B, priority was given to areas with high density of socially and economically backward people.

Under RUSA 1.0, Government of India had approved for the State of Assam 3 New Professional Colleges (Engineering) at Nagaon, Nalbari and Udalguri districts in the 5th Project Approval Board meeting of MHRD held on 10th December 2014. Accordingly, for construction of these Professional Colleges, 1st installment of Central Share amounting to Rs 35.10 crore and a matching State Share of Rs 3.9 crore was transferred to RUSA account on 28/01/2019 and 01/02/2019 respectively. As per the approval of the Government of Assam, it was initially decided to implement the projects through Assam State Housing Board (ASHB) and subsequently MoA was signed with the agency on 19/08/2019. However, due to delay on the part of ASHB in the entire process of implementation of the projects, Government of Assam decided to withdraw the responsibility of execution of construction works of these 3 Professional Colleges at Nalbari, Udalguri and Nagaon districts from ASHB. Consequently, the MoA was cancelled with ASHB and the job has been entrusted to PWD (B). All the necessary documents including administrative approval, land documents and trace maps related to the 3 professional colleges have been handed over to PWD (B) to speed up the process of construction works of these three colleges.

10.2 Nalbari Engineering College

Nalbari Engineering College got its approval in the 5th PAB meeting of MHRD with a sanctioned amount of Rs 26 crore. The Detailed Project Report (DPR) for the establishment

of the proposed engineering college was approved by MHRD and subsequently the 1st installment of the central share amounting to Rs 11.70 crore was released. The state share of Rs 1.17 crore was released by the Government of Assam at a later date. The allotted land for the college measuring 100 bighas (33.05 acres) is at Sathamou village, Pub-Banbhag Mouza under Ghograpar circle in the Nalbari district and is situated at a distance of approximately 12 km from the district headquarter. The site was digitally launched by the Honourable Prime Minister of India, Sri Narendra Modi on 3rd February, 2019. A temporary campus at Kumar Bhaskar Varman Sanskrit & Ancient Studies University, Nalbari has been identified for starting the engineering college initially with a few courses.

10.3 Udalguri Engineering College

The 5th PAB meeting of MHRD approved Udalguri Engineering College with a sanctioned amount of Rs 26 crore. With the approval of the Detailed Project Report (DPR) by MHRD, the 1st installment of central share amounting to Rs 11.70 crore has been released. Subsequently, the state share of Rs 1.17 crore was released by the Government of Assam. The site for construction of Udalguri Engineering College is situated at Nalkhamara village, Ambagaon Mouza under Udalguri Revenue Circle at a distance of approximately 10 km from the district headquarter. The allotted land measures 32 bigha 2 katha 10 lecha (10.74 acres). The site was digitally launched by the Honourable Prime Minister, Sri Narendra Modi on 3rd February, 2019.

10.4 Nagaon Engineering College

Nagaon Engineering College too got its approval in the 5th PAB meeting of MHRD with a sanctioned amount of Rs 26 crore. The Detailed Project Report (DPR) was approved by the MHRD and subsequently the 1st installment of the central share amounting to Rs 11.70 crore has been released. The state share of Rs 1.17 crore was also released by the Government of Assam at a later date. The allotted land for the college measures 35 bighas (11.56 acres) at Gatanga village, Rangagara Mouza under Samaguri Revenue Circle in the Nagaon district and is situated at a distance of approximately 25 km from the district headquarter. Nowgong Polytechnic at Nagaon which is a government institute has been identified as a temporary campus for starting the proposed Nagaon Engineering College.

Chapter - 11

Conclusion

1. Under the component Infrastructure Grants to Universities-
 - a. New Construction: Gauhati University and Dibrugarh University have together constructed two girls hostel, 13 toilets for girls, 14 toilets for boys and 11 laboratories with a total area of 5100 sq. mt. and a cost of Rs. 1405.72 lakhs.
 - b. Renovation: The two universities have renovated their academic blocks, administrative blocks, campus, hostels, toilets, libraries, smart classrooms, auditoriums, canteens/cafeterias, laboratories, computer centres/e-campus and playgrounds. The total amount incurred for these renovation work was Rs. 1394.28 lakhs.
 - c. New Equipments: Sports facilities have been enhanced in the universities and they have also purchased computers, laboratory equipments and books/e-journals. Total amount spent was Rs. 1200 lakhs.

2. Under the component Infrastructure Grants to Colleges-
 - a. New Construction: Of the 87 beneficiary colleges
 - 69 colleges have constructed classrooms. The total number being 266 with a total area of 17127.327 sq. mt. and a total cost of Rs. 3781.33 lakhs.
 - 26 colleges have constructed toilet blocks. Total number of toilet blocks constructed was 224, the total area being 933.05 sq. mt. and amount allocated was Rs.317.26lakhs.
 - 16 colleges have constructed computer centres/ seminar halls. Total area of construction was 1766.31 sq. mt. and allocated fund was Rs.435.46 lakhs.
 - 6 colleges have spent in hostels increasing the number of beds by 138 with a total cost of Rs.291 lakhs.
 - 18 colleges have together constructed 32 number of common rooms of area 1444.41 sq. mt. and total fund allocated was Rs. 466.66 lakhs.
 - 8 colleges have constructed canteens. The area being 429.43 sq. mt. and cost Rs. 161.72 lakhs.
 - 20 colleges together have constructed 51 number of laboratories with a total area of 2158.02 sq. mt. and a cost of Rs 636.57 lakhs.
 - b. Renovation: Of the 87 beneficiary colleges
 - 40 colleges have renovated their academic blocks incurring a total cost of Rs 690.92 lakhs.
 - 36 colleges have renovated their administrative blocks.
 - 74 colleges have developed their campuses at a total cost of Rs 1344.22 lakhs.
 - 27 colleges have renovated their hostels.
 - 39 colleges have renovated a total of 101 toilets at a total cost of Rs 220.86 lakhs.
 - 41 colleges have renovated their libraries incurring a total cost of Rs. 554 lakhs.

- 65 colleges have renovated their classrooms. A total of 786 number of classrooms have been renovated and total cost incurred in the renovation work was Rs. 1346 lakhs.
 - 38 colleges have renovated their auditoriums at a total cost of Rs. 624.5 lakhs
 - 31 colleges have renovated their canteens/cafeterias amounting to a total cost of Rs. 206 lakhs.
 - 31 colleges have renovated their laboratories with a total cost of Rs. 322 lakhs.
 - 16 colleges have renovated a total of 19 numbers of computer centres/ seminar halls with a total cost of Rs. 103.5 lakhs.
- c. New Equipments: Of the 87 beneficiary colleges
- 77 colleges have enhanced the quality of their sports facilities.
 - 75 colleges have purchased computers, the total number of computers purchased being 1681 costing Rs 903.4 lakhs.
 - 41 colleges have purchased a total of 141 digital classroom equipments costing Rs. 495.5 lakhs.
 - 47 colleges have purchased a total of 154 number of routers in order to have a wifi enabled campus.
 - 18 colleges have created their college websites.
 - 80 colleges have purchased together a total of 30345 number of laboratory equipments costing Rs. 1508 lakhs.
 - 85 colleges have purchased books and journals worth Rs. 1197.6 lakhs.
3. Under the component Upgradation of existing Degree Colleges to Model Degree Colleges-
- a. New Construction: The selected five colleges have newly constructed laboratories and computer centres. The number of laboratory rooms constructed being 20 and the number of rooms for computer centres being 9.
 - b. Renovation: The five selected colleges have renovated their academic buildings, campus, hostels, classrooms & technologically enabled classrooms, toilets, libraries, auditoriums and canteens/ cafeterias.
 - c. New Equipments: Under new equipments these five colleges have purchased sports equipments, computers, books, journals and e-resources.
4. Under the component Equity Initiatives-
- a. Sub Component- Disabled friendly facilities: Funds for this sub-component have been received by Sonapur College, Jorhat Engineering College, Cotton College (now Cotton University) and Debraj Roy College. These institutions have constructed barrier free facilities like Ramps, Disabled Friendly Toilets etc. and have purchased wheel chairs, braille books, audio books, hearing aids, smart canes, braille slates etc.
 - b. Sub Component- Transportation Facilities: Funds for this sub-component have been received by Bineswar Brahma Engineering College and Dibrugarh Hanumanbax

- Surajmall Kanoi College. They have provided free transportation facilities to female and differently abled students.
- c. Sub Component- Finishing School: Funds for the Finishing School sub-component have been received by Anandaram Dhekial Phookan College, Kokrajhar Government College, Birjhora Mahavidyalaya, Digboi College, Gauhati Commerce College, Halflong Government College, Madhab Choudhury College, Namrup College, Pramathesh Barua College, Hojai College, and Srikishan Sarda College. They have provided training to the students of their institutions and nearby colleges. The training imparted was on soft skills, communication skills, development of positive attitude towards work, interview skills, resume making, group discussion etc.
 - d. Sub Component- Training to trainers of finishing school: Funds for this sub- component have been received by Madhab Choudhury College, Srikishan Sarda College, and Gauhati Commerce College. These institutions provided training to the trainers of Finishing School so as to create mentors to provide training to the students of different colleges throughout Assam in order to encourage them for higher studies and motivate them to have a higher platform in their career.
 - e. Sub Component- Language Laboratories: Funds for this sub-component have been received by Biswanath College, Devi Charan Barua Girls, Gurucharan College, Margherita College, Sadiya College, Kaliabor College, Maibong College, Silapathar College, Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya, Kharupetia College, Srikishan Sarda College and North Lakhimpur College. These institutions have set up language laboratories for the maximum benefit of their students as they can avail the facility to enhance their language skills which includes proper pronunciation, speaking etc.
5. Under Equity Initiatives, Dibrugarh University has also received funds under the component disabled friendly facilities, finishing school and training to trainers of finishing school. Dibrugarh University has made provisions for many disabled friendly facilities like ramp & railing, disabled friendly toilet, disabled friendly equipments, braille books, audio books, hearing aids and software. The university has also trained trainers for finishing school.
 6. Under the component New Model Degree Colleges (Erstwhile) the Government of Assam has decided to set up 12 model degree colleges in 12 Educationally Backward Districts (EBDs) of the state. Of these, 5 MDCs are operational as of today. These 5 MDCs are PDUAM- Dalgaon, PDUAM- Behali, PDUAM- Amjonga, PDUAM- Tulungia and PDUAM- Eraligool.
 7. New Colleges (Professional) is a component under RUSA 1.0 to create new professional colleges in regions and districts in the country where the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in technical and professional education is below national averages. Under RUSA 1.0 the state of Assam has got an approval from the Government of India to establish 3 New Professional Colleges (Engineering) at

Nagaon, Nalbari and Udalguri districts. Total approved amount earmarked for each college is Rs. 26 crores.

8. RUSA 1.0 has helped the different beneficiary institutions to improve their infrastructural facilities. There has been a significant increase in the number of classrooms, digital classrooms, laboratories, libraries, computer/IT facilities, hostels for boys and girls, auditoriums etc which has benefitted the student community to a large extent.
9. There has also been an enhancement of student facilities like canteens, toilets for both boys and girls, common rooms for both boys and girls, sports facilities and so on.
10. With the implementation of RUSA 1.0 there has been an improvement in the number of institutions accredited and their scores in Assam as RUSA funding is conditional to NAAC accreditation.
11. RUSA 1.0 in Assam has improved access, equity and accessibility of higher education in the State through academic reforms, governance reforms, affiliation reforms etc.
12. There has been an improvement in equity in higher education as RUSA 1.0 in Assam has been providing adequate opportunities of higher education to socially deprived communities and has also been promoting inclusion of women, minorities, SC/ST/OBCs and differently abled persons through its Erstwhile MDCs, Up gradation of existing degree colleges to MDCs and Equity Initiative components.
13. RUSA 1.0 has also taken the initiative to promote a spirit of healthy competition amongst institutions to excel in quality, research and innovation.
14. For proper monitoring and evaluation system of RUSA 1.0, geo tagging, public financial management system, fund tracker, reform tracker and video conferences have been operational in Assam.

The way forward:

- a. The libraries of our institutions need to be modernized, digitalized and equipped with ultra-modern software so that the institutions are able to meet the rising demands of education through Open Education Resources (OER) and Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs). This aspect should be taken seriously in RUSA 2.0.
- b. Besides opening up of new institutions RUSA 2.0 needs to strengthen the existing ones and also needs to expand avenues of extension and distance education which will lead to the increase of enrolment of students.

- c. Under RUSA 1.0 emphasis has been laid on the semester system, Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), mandatory accreditation of higher education institutions, issues related to employability, streamlining of the admission process, continuous internal evaluation together with end semester evaluation, etc. These are fundamentally significant initiatives to make higher education relevant in today's opportunity universe and therefore RUSA 2.0 will need to put in place a mechanism of continuous monitoring to ensure implementation of these initiatives with sincerity and commitment.

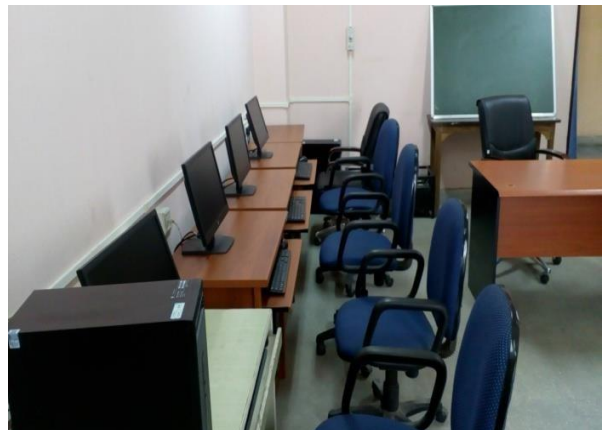
